VeriSign Extended Validation SSL Certificates

VeriSign SSL Certificates with Extended Validation are now available for purchase online. You will need access to your Web server during the enrollment and installation process. Enrollment takes approximately 20 minutes to complete. For a general description of the enrollment process, please see the information below:

	Step-by-Step Overview
Step 1	<p>Generate a CSR</p> <p>The CSR is a string of text generated by your server software that contains all the information VeriSign will authenticate and validate. This string of text is delivered to VeriSign during the enrollment process. To generate a CSR, you will need to know what kind of server software is running on your Web server to choose the correct instructions.</p> <p>NOTE: Make sure the Country, State and Locality used in your CSR is for the jurisdiction where your organization is registered, e.g., if your primary registration is in Delaware, you must use Delaware in your CSR, even if you are also registered in another state</p>
Step 2	<p>Enrollment</p> <p>Once you have determined which Extended Validation SSL certificate to purchase, you will need your CSR with the exact domain name of the site you intend to secure.</p> <p>VeriSign must verify your enrollment information before you receive your installation instructions. This step takes anywhere from a few hours to a few days, depending on the documentation you provide during the enrollment process and your response to additional requests for information. Step 3	<p>Installation Instructions</p> <p>Once your information has been validated, VeriSign will email the certificate in the form of a text file to install on your server. Choose the appropriate installation instructions for your server software and for your product. Unlike the standard SSL certificates offered by VeriSign, certificates with Extended Validation require the installation of 2 CA certificates: the Extended Validation Root CA and the EV Intermediate CA certificate.</p> <p>Please see our Installation Guide for further details regarding the certificate installation.</p>
